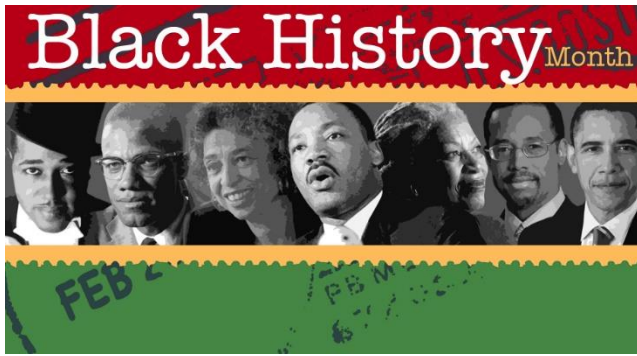

The Media Center will once again be skyping for Read Across America. An email will be sent shortly to set up a schedule for those that wish to participate.



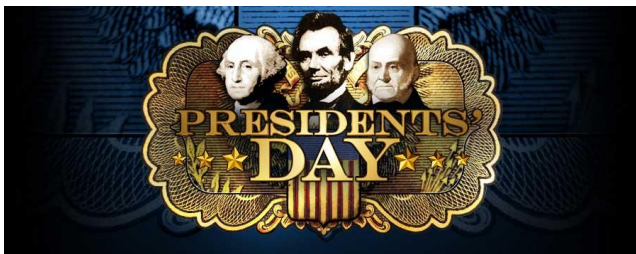
