 - Students may come in anytime as long as they have a pass from a teacher
 - Passes have been placed in your mailboxes. Please keep one full sheet to make additional copies.
 - Teachers may bring their classes at any time for book check out **without** using the scheduling calendar.
 - The calendar only needs to be utilized when support is required from the librarian. You may schedule the librarian for 30 minute increments but remain in the library for as long as necessary. The calendar is accessible through your google calendar. Choose the appropriate library calendar from the drop down menu when you create a calendar event.
