E. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT – Dr. Rocco Tomazic

1. Public Hearing on the 2019-2020 Budget

Dr. Tomazic invited Dr. Howe to make his presentation to the Board on the Final Budget for FY20. At this time Dr. Howe gave a power point presentation that reviewed the steps taken to reach the reach the Public Hearing this evening. He shared with the Board that due to S2 the District received approximately \$1.4 million in additional aid this year, however we remain under adequate, but are moving towards adequacy. We are now waiting for the State legislature and governor to adopt the final FY 20 state budget so that the state aid numbers become final. He then opened the floor for anyone from the public wanting to come forward to comment on the FY 20 budget and seeing none closed the public hearing at 7:21 PM.

2. Calendar/Announcements

- Dr. Tomazic began his report with three pen and ink corrections to the Agenda. On page 3 – strike third longevity; page 14 add * next to Gordon and finally page 19 correction of date for Item 15
- We have 3 less students than last meeting with 1,696 in District and 17 out of District for a total of 1,713. This represents 107 unhoused students. Attendance is 95.72% with 135 students (7.8%) on pace for chronic absenteeism, the principals are in contact with these families to emphasize the importance of attendance at school.
- Kindergarten registration is complete with 144 incoming students which is 23 less than last year. However, registration continues right up until the start of school, and we are on pace to have about the same number of kindergarteners next year.
- Pre-K registration is showing more students than last year and we will most likely end up needing to have a lottery this year for seats if the number of students registered by the deadline exceed the number of available seats in the program.
- Construction Update:
 - FLC – berm work continues, two of the three new playgrounds had permanent surface installed over break, the third is waiting for the swap out of one apparatus and then the permanent surfacing can be installed, likely over the summer.
 - PAC – renovation work on the old kitchen area continues and looks to be on time for September opening.
- NJSLA testing, the replacement for PARCC, will begin this week with all elementary students and middle school next week. Today and tomorrow the 8th grade will take the new science test, next week that test is administered to the 5th grade.
- On Thursday we will have a bid opening for FLC duct work, generator, and the maintenance shed.
- Next Wednesday will be the end of interim MP4, Principals to notify parents of any students who will be retained.

WHEREAS, the Freehold Borough Board of Education adopted a tentative budget on March 18, 2019 to be submitted to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval, and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was approved by the Executive County Superintendent of Schools on April 1, 2019 and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was advertised in the legal section of the Asbury Park Press on April 5, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was presented to the public during a public hearing on May 6, 2019; and

Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement

WHEREAS, the Freehold Borough Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.2 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel as defined in NJAC 6A:23A-1.2, which includes attendance at regularly scheduled in-State county meetings, Department or Association sponsored events or in-State professional development activities for which the registration fee does not exceed \$150.00 per employee or board member, where prior Board approval shall not be required unless the annual threshold for a staff member exceeds \$1,500 in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

WHEREAS, the Freehold Borough Board of Education established \$75,000 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$18,949.86 as of this date; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A: 23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$75,000 for all staff and board members for the 2019-2020 school year.

RESOLVED, that the amount required for school purposes in the school district of Freehold Borough, County of Monmouth for the 2019-2020 school year is \$10,775,172 and is required to be levied for local school district purposes.

WHEREAS, Article VIII, § IV, ¶ 1 of the New Jersey Constitution requires the Legislature to provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools; and

WHEREAS, to satisfy this Constitutional mandate, the Legislature adopted the School Funding Reform Act of 2008 (“SFRA”), P.L. 2007, c. 260 (N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-43 to -63), which established a school funding formula “to develop an equitable and predictable way to distribute State aid;” and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-8.1(a) requires each district board of education adopt a budget that provides for a thorough and efficient (T&E) education; and

WHEREAS, considering the inadequacy of the State aid provided to the District, District Administration has done its best to prepare a budget which attempts to provide for a T&E education; however, additional State aid – in accordance with SFRA – would enable the District to provide for a T&E education.

WHEREAS, on or about December 9, 2018 the Freehold Borough Board of Education agreed to a stipulation of dismissal in the Office of Administrative Law Matter EDU 04455-2018S entitled The Board of Education of the Borough of Freehold et al. v. State of New Jersey et al.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that stipulation of dismissal the Board and the State agreed to dismiss the instant case based upon the passage of P.L.2007, c.260, amending P.L.2007, c.62, and repealing section 5 of P.L.2007, c.260, an "Act concerning State and local financing of school districts," and on information and belief of the Board the current distribution of funding to the district by the State is being performed pursuant to that law commonly known as "S-2" for Fiscal Year 2020.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves the 2019-20 as prepared by District Administration and authorizes the Superintendent and the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary to implement the 2019-2020 budget pursuant to local and state policies.
